Yorta Yorta Nation Aboriginal Corporation (YYNAC)

[Yorta Yorta Nation Aboriginal Corporation \(YYNAC\)](#) is an Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisation representing the Yorta Yorta people across Northern Victoria and Southern New South Wales. The organisation works to protect culture, strengthen community wellbeing, care for Country, and support self-determination for current and future generations.

YYNAC represents the interests and aspirations of the Yorta Yorta Nation and plays an important role in cultural heritage protection, environmental stewardship, community development, employment initiatives, and Indigenous leadership. Guided by Traditional Owner knowledge and strong community governance, the organisation continues to create opportunities that benefit people, culture, and Country.

Yorta Yorta Country is located throughout the Murray-Goulburn region and includes significant waterways such as the Dhungala (Murray River), Kaiela (Goulburn River), and Yakoa (Campaspe River). These landscapes have sustained Yorta Yorta people for thousands of years and remain central to cultural identity, knowledge, and community life.

One of the key areas of focus for YYNAC is cultural heritage protection. The organisation works to ensure culturally significant places, stories, traditions, and knowledge systems are respected and preserved. Through consultation, monitoring, education, and engagement with stakeholders, YYNAC helps safeguard heritage for future generations.

Caring for Country is another important part of the organisation's work. Through Indigenous land management, natural resource management, ecological restoration, and environmental stewardship initiatives, YYNAC supports healthier landscapes and stronger environmental outcomes. These activities combine Traditional Owner knowledge with contemporary environmental practices to protect biodiversity, waterways, and culturally significant sites.

YYNAC also supports community-led development and Indigenous self-determination. Community members, Elders, and leaders play an important role in shaping decisions and setting priorities. This approach ensures that programs and initiatives reflect the needs, aspirations, and values of the Yorta Yorta people.

Employment and workforce development remain important priorities. Through partnerships, enterprise activities, training opportunities, and employment programs, the organisation helps create meaningful pathways for Indigenous participation and economic
