An IP44 rating works well for covered balconies with limited exposure. However, if your balcony is open and regularly exposed to rain or heavy dust, choose fixtures with an IP65 rating they offer better protection and longer-lasting performance.

When selecting fixtures, consider the placement height carefully. Lights installed too low may collect dirt more quickly or become vulnerable to accidental damage. Proper positioning also improves light distribution and safety.

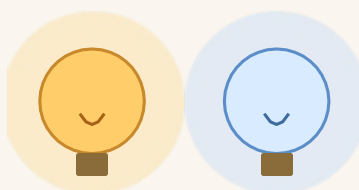

For a cozy setting, choose warm light between 2700K and 3000K ideal for evenings. Cooler lighting above 4000K provides greater clarity and works well when better visibility is required. Smaller balconies often need around 300 to 500 lumens, while larger spaces may benefit from additional fixtures instead of one overly bright light.

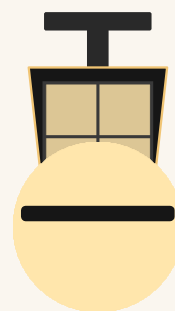
Many homeowners combine outdoor wall lights with LED strips for layered lighting improving comfort while avoiding harsh shadows in compact apartment balconies.

3 Style & Aesthetic: Match Your Home

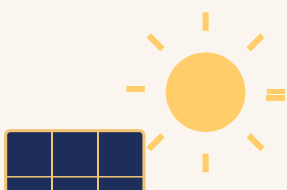
