Most of our clients come to us after years of living with a builder-grade closet that was never built for real life. A single shelf and a rod does not work for a household with growing kids, seasonal wardrobes, or two people sharing one space. Built-in drawers let you separate folded clothing, keep jewelry and accessories organized, and free up hanging space for the garments that actually need it. Every drawer we install glides on solid hardware and is finished in the same wood tone as the rest of the unit, so the whole system reads as one cohesive piece rather than a patchwork of add-ons.

For homeowners with a dedicated dressing room, our [Walk in Closet Cabinets](#) are built to use every inch of wall space without feeling like a warehouse. We design around your existing wardrobe first, counting coats, dresses, folded sweaters, and shoe pairs before a single panel is cut. The result is a layout with the right mix of hanging rods, open shelving, and closed cabinetry, finished with the kind of hardware and trim you would expect in a custom kitchen. Mirrored doors, brass pulls, and warm oak veneers are among our most popular finishes because they turn a functional room into one that feels like part of the home's design story.

Not every home has room for a full dressing suite, and that is where thoughtful planning matters most. A [Small Walk in Closet](#) can hold just as much as a larger one if the layout is planned correctly, using double-hang sections, slim drawer stacks, and corner-optimized shelving instead of wasted floor space. We often combine a compact footprint with floor-to-ceiling storage, curved cabinetry to soften tight corners, and a bench or mirror to make the space feel finished rather than squeezed in.

None of this works without a solid shelving plan underneath it. Our [Walk in Closet Shelving](#) is built from real wood and engineered to hold weight without sagging over time, something laminate particle board systems struggle with after a few seasons of use. We adjust shelf spacing to match what you actually store, from bulky sweaters to folded linens, and finish every edge so nothing snags fabric or looks unfinished at eye level.

We visit your space, listen to how you live in it, and design custom millwork that fits your home rather than asking your home to fit a standard size.
